

### FILM NIGHT AT BETHLEHEM



On Friday 28 January the film will be 'Miracles from Heaven', which is based on the true story of Christy and her 10-year-old daughter Anna. When Anna is diagnosed with a rare, incurable disease, Christy becomes a fierce advocate for her daughter's healing. When Anna has a freak accident, an extraordinary miracle unfolds in the wake of her dramatic rescue that leaves medical specialists mystified.

Tea and coffee will be served from 7.00 pm. The film will start at 7.30 pm. A collection will be taken for Sightsavers, an international charity working in more than 30 countries to prevent avoidable blindness.

### **GEORGETOWN SPRUCES UP**

To finance this large project it has been decided to organise some fund raising events to offset at least some of the project costs. All gifts contributed will be very much appreciated and will be received with thanksgiving at the 10.30am Morning Service on 13 February led by Rev Danny.

Further fund raising projects are planned for later in the year, especially all the concerts in the tradition of Thursday Night is Music Night, though this title has to be temporarily changed to ANY Night is Music night as their UK guests will be performing on various nights of the week according to their travel programme.



This also assumes that Covid allows Georgetown to continue concerts and that travel restrictions allow their UK performers to arrive!

The congregation are meeting for Sunday morning worship in the hall for January and February, with Rowland tinkling the ivories of the piano. All are looking forward to returning to worship in a bright, freshly painted church, which will also be looking smart for the Circuit meeting on 24 March, not to mention the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary next year.

### A PRAYER FOR TONGA

The President and Vice President have expressed their concern over the situation in Tonga caused by a volcanic eruption on Saturday and subsequent tsunami. They ask the Methodist people to pray for those affected.

Loving God, we stand in awe at the power of creation seen in volcano and tsunami, recognising the smallness and weakness of our own existence. Yet you tell us that each person is special and important to you, and in that confidence we hold before you the people of Tonga as they deal with the aftermath of the volcanic eruption.

We are still waiting for details, but you know the feelings and needs of each person there, and we pray that you would grant calm and courage to those



directly involved, and the strengthening of bonds as people support each other. Especially we ask for wisdom for national and community leaders as they look for a way ahead, and for religious leaders, including President Finau Ahio and ministers of our Methodist Partner, The Free

Wesleyan Church of Tonga, as they try to offer spiritual and emotional support.

We pray also for the peace of your presence for all those around the world waiting for news of family and friends, wanting to believe that the reports so far of little damage and no loss of life are true, but fearful of different news when the situation becomes clear.

We give thanks for the moves within the Pacific and the wider international community to provide support for Tonga, and pray that there will soon be opportunity to allow appropriate relief to be channelled quickly, especially the provision of clean drinking water. And although now everything is dismal and grey from volcanic ash, may the people of Tonga be able to hold on to the hope of the return of colour and joy to their land.




