

St Aubin Methodist Church Outreach Project 2025



2025 marks the 80th anniversary of the Liberation and the Parish of St Brelade has asked that a Liberation Exhibition be held in St Aubin's Methosit Church in May. It is therefore fitting that the church continues its support for the Red Cross in remembrance of the food relief the organisation provided to the residents of Jersey in World War II. Sadly, wars and natural disasters continue to affect many areas of our world and the work of the Red Cross and other relief agencies is as vital as ever.

Volunteers will be needed to help keep the church open during the Liberation celebrations, if you think you might be able to help please contact the church office. Thank you!

A total of £2,163.33 was raised in 2025 and presented to representatives of the Jersey branch of the Red Cross at the Sunday 5th January service. The schools, who held Carol Services in the church, also donated with around a further £350 to be added to the total. Well done everyone involved!
