#### REMEMBRANCE AROUND THE CIRCUIT

#### St Martin's Church

On Thursday 11 November, Remembrance Day, an audience of some eighty gathered at St Martin's Methodist Church to share in a Remembrance Tribute in Prose, Poetry and Music, devised by Tim Pollard and Alan Mollet. This very much followed the lines of Tim's very popular presentations on Radio Jersey in former times. Tim's expert musical selections, sometimes accompanied readings from him, were interspersed with organ and piano items from Alan. Irene Green spoke two very moving poems reflecting on the views of the young to conflict and war, while lan Ronayne brought the traumas of war very vividly as he retold the biographies of local folk as they dealt with the all too real experiences of war. The audience was also treated to three very moving items, beautifully performed by Concordia conducted by Hugh Lincé.

They were honoured to have two Chelsea Hospital Pensioners sharing in this programme. The sum of £270 was collected for the Poppy Appeal.


The Remembrance Sunday Service was the customary ecumenical event at the Parish Church led by the Rector the Rev'd Jonny Scott. For the first time, the service began in the church at 10.00 am and concluded with the usual Cenotaph ceremony with the reading of names on the Roll of Honour from the Parish's Connétable and Deputy and the Last



Post and Silence at 11.00; a solemn and moving time of remembrance.









At Ebenezer the children made poppies and handed them out to all the congregation who then came forward to place them on the table, remembering the service and sacrifice of those who lost their lives in WW1, WW2 and in other conflicts.

- a. Celebration/sit-down meal at our hall in Minden Street, primarily aimed at those who would be on their own. (We have limited space therefore please get any applications in quick).
- b. Christmas dinner delivered to individuals and families. For those who will be on their own at home, we will spend some time on Christmas morning checking in and spreading a bit of joy with a doorstep visit.

We have a large number of brand-new toys made available from our toy appeal at The Entertainer. Please feel free to refer families to us, who can come and select from the pile!

Working with Jersey Christmas appeal, we are a referring agency into the appeal for voucher support.

All year-round support that will continue through the Christmas period:

 a. Our food bank will be running throughout Christmas for those in short-term financial crisis.
 Our food parcels include toiletries and baby items such as nappies/wipes/formula. For longer term support, ie more than 6 weeks, please consider referring to the other foodbanks on the island.



- Our voucher support will continue to be available throughout the Christmas period, for those in immediate financial hardship. This includes utility top-ups (Jersey Electric, heating oil, and Jersey Gas) and supermarket vouchers.
- c. Community cafe running through to Christmas Eve, offering free soup daily.

d. Pastoral support - we are always happy to listen and chat with people and offer pastoral support and/or signposting as appropriate, in our friendly community cafe.

# **JERSEY WOMEN'S REFUGE APPEAL**

Thursday 25 November is International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. To support this aim, Jersey Women's Refuge has launched its 21K Club initiative with the hope of generating £210,000 each year.



It costs around £650,000 annually to provide 24/7 services for our safe house and hotline and counselling to children, young people and women. The Government of Jersey provides a grant of some £250,000, leaving an annual funding gap of £400,000. Donors are asked to set up direct debits or one off payments of £10 or more per year.

There has been a 50% rise in one off callers contacting the helpline and 26% more people being admitted to the Refuge compared to previous years. For more information:
