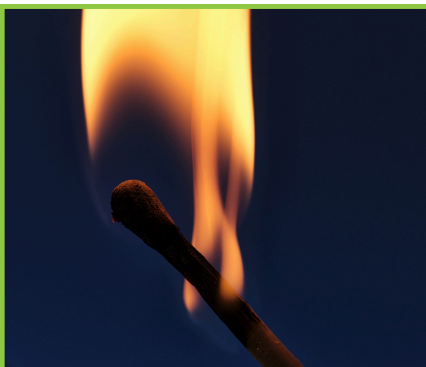
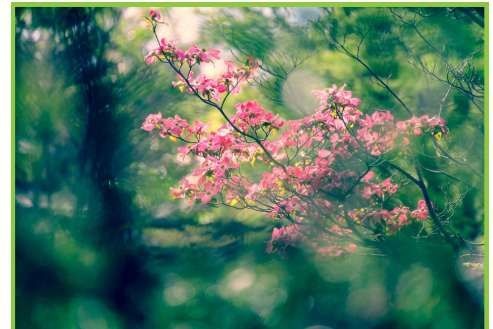


Week commencing 10th May

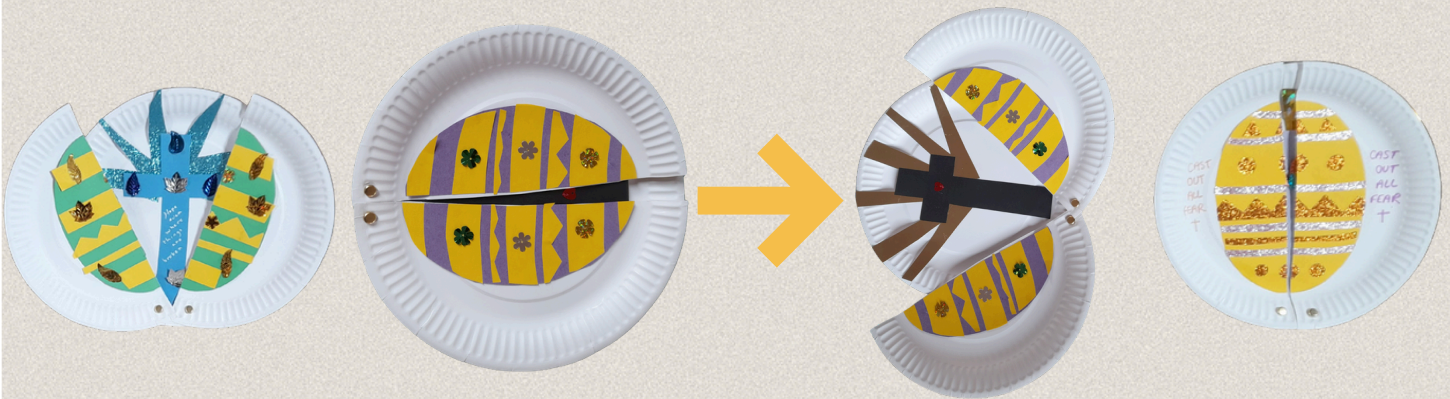
Easter Sunday AT EBENEZER

As you open the egg you see a cross shining out, which indicates the Hope and New Life of Jesus's resurrection.
