

Update on Alive and Well

As this year draws to a close, we reflect on the positive steps that Alive and Well has presented this past year.

There have been real signs of change as congregations appreciate the reasons behind a Plan with more united services / LA's and face the reality of the situation. We thank all churches for their graciousness during this period of transition.

What's been exciting is what we've gained. There is a feeling that when we meet together it feels we belong to something bigger and there are opportunities to build new relationships. Churches are actively exploring different forms of worship, new talents have been unleashed by those willing to lead an LA and there has been a sharing of resources that are helpful for preparing LA services.

Churches are proactively exploring opportunities to see what can be done together in a creative way. In the east, for example, SHMC, St Martin, Georgetown and Ebenezer are experimenting with new ways of working, holding their Stewards' meetings in the same place and at the same time. A 6-week Bible Study led by Rev Tony and Helen on Philippians was very well attended with over 20 people from different congregations attending. Following on from this, a Circuit-wide Advent course at Georgetown will be led by Rev Tony and Helen over three Tuesdays from 1.00pm-2.15pm, starting on 5th December.

Some of our Churches have identified a heart for youth work/work with young families as a priority and a meeting is scheduled for January 10th, 1.00pm at St Helier during which they will share their emerging plans, but also explore how we might work together to create something new across the Circuit. To know more speak to Tony or Lou Hicklin.

So as we begin a new calendar year with a Plan that is sustainable for the time being, but delicate, we will continue to explore new opportunities and directions for our Circuit. We ask for your prayers that we may see hidden treasurers in our journey ahead and that our Alive and Well plans are guided by the Holy Spirit in grace and love.


Being Circuit: Jean Treleven

Jean's (née Le Boutillier) formative years began at Sunday School with Mrs Le Marquand at St John's Congregational Church (later the URC). She then moved on to Sunday School at Sion and 'graduated' to their "exciting" youth club run by the inspirational Don and Dulcie De La Haye where they put on shows and performances. She also enjoyed evenings at the youth club at Georgetown and travelled to the Royal Albert Hall with the MAYC. After



completing her degree in Geography at Goldsmiths College and doing her teacher training, she returned to the island to teach and ran the Sion youth club herself.

After several years teaching in the Island, Jean landed her dream job in Schools Radio based at Highlands. She produced radio programmes and audio visual resources supporting schools with sound effects for their dramatic productions.



Led by Rev John Farley and Rev Charles Carnahan (on secondment from the USA) and possibly gently cajoled by Dr John Le Gresley, Jean's first major contribution to the Jersey Circuit was in 1986 when she helped to organise a survey of the Methodist Church, The Way Forward. This large piece of work started the Circuit thinking about how to operate with smaller numbers.

Jean did not play an active role in church life whilst she and husband John lived in Chiswick raising their young twin daughters, Menna and Jenna and she retrained in primary school teaching to fit around the girls. In 2000 the family returned to Jersey, joining SHMC with Jean becoming first



a church steward and then a Circuit steward and the girls marrying together there in 2020, quite an event in the local media!

Her current role is CI District EDI Officer (Equality, Diversity and Inclusivity) and many of those who hold roles in the Jersey Circuit will have attended her training sessions this year at Georgetown when she rolled out the Methodist Church's JDS strategy (Justice, Dignity and Solidarity). In June she had the opportunity to attend Conference 2023 in Birmingham (see her report in the July 2023 newsletter) and she was inspired by the vision of those on the main platform and at the fringe events. Church administators around the Circuit are grateful to her for her support on technical issues with running their websites, skills she gained during her final two years at Education working with on-line learning.

Ever the teacher and communicator even in retirement, Jean is currently Education Officer for Jersey Dairy and leads groups of mostly primary school children around dairy farms and the Dairy explaining the 'grass to glass' process.



Since retirement, Jean has re-immersed herself in her passion of all things Jersey. A long-time member of the

Société Jersiaise, back in 1983 Jean was responsible for the reproduction of the 1787/95 Richmond map of Jersey. She is a Jerriais speaker and helps to promote it in schools. Listen to her reading her <u>Lettre Jerriaise</u> on BBC Radio Jersey in October. Able to trace her family origins back to the Norman period, very appropriately she enjoys traditional Norman dancing with Les Chaboleurs (the shufflers) at Hamptonne and the Jersey festivals like the Corn Riots, Black Butter etc. She is also a Blue Badge Guide and a specialist in the 17th century and the Civil War, church history and the Island's geology. She has led groups (including Presidents of the Methodist

Conference on their annual visits and a group of Canadian Methodists) around the churches of St Helier and has made her own impressive Royal Mace!









Since her school days Jean has always loved sewing and stitching and in 2014 she led the team which made the cushions for the SHMC balcony pews and more recently has helped with the church Christmas decorations. When at home, amongst her crafting she enjoys knitting (nativity sets started by Rev Elaine Halls and characters like Maisie (below)), tapestry (conventional and Bayeux) and applique.











As well as singing in the Jersey Festival Choir, she supports the family and specially little grandson Jasper. Having joined her husband John (newsletter August 2023) as he refereed tennis at the Island Games in Gotland, Gibraltar and Guernsey, she is hoping to visit Orkney to study its unique archeology. One hopes the local guide will have done his homework!



Something New - Somewhere New

New Places for New People (NPNP) is a Connexional Initiative aimed at creating a culture of church planting and pioneering across the Methodist Church. It is focused on an end result of new Christian communities and new Christian disciples.

Here in the Channel Islands we've starting to try to discern what it might look like for our particular context – and how it might work across all four islands. We've got a Core Group of six people – led by Rev David Stretton – and Lorraine Wheeler and Katie Norman are the Jersey representatives. Every church member should have received a special prayer card by now – and we are inviting everyone to pray the prayer regularly. There is also a monthly twenty-minute Zoom prayer meeting – email me and I'll send you the link.

Over the next few months, we'll be putting together some proposals for people to think about and discuss – and we hope that the main project will launch towards the end of 2024. In the meantime, the District has made £500 available to every church to have a go at doing something new – so if you've got an idea then speak with your minister who has the simple one-page application form.

As advertised at our recent District and Circuit meetings, we're gathering on Zoom once a month to pray together for inspiration, guidance, courage, strength and wisdom as we move the NPNP project forward. Please join us if you can - 6.30-6.50pm - just 20 minutes once a month on a Monday evening: 18 December, 22 January, 26 February, 25 March and 22 April

The annual Remembrance ceremony at Trinity took place down in Petit Port Bay, Egypt, where Captain Ayton landed. He was a member of a Joint Allied unit who landed in Jersey in December 1943 on a reconnaissance mission but he unfortunately died from injuries sustained during the mission. He will always be remembered by the Parish of Trinity for making the ultimate sacrifice.

Considering there were still very strong winds that morning and a lot of rain overnight, nearly fifty people attended, including many new faces which is good for the future. The Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Jeremy Kyd CBE, the Dean of Jersey and the Rector and Parish Connétable led the short service, at which some eight wreaths were laid.

At the service on Remembrance Sunday morning Jasper poignantly played the National Anthem on the French horn before he and William were blessed by Rev Tony.
